TI-Nspire Math Student Competition 2024

Rules and Regulations

Entry to Competition

- A. This competition is open to all high school students from international schools around the Asian region.
- B. All submissions have to be done through the school, by a teacher-in-charge.
- C. Interested schools are requested to express the Interest to Join by completing the registration form on or before Mar 22, 2024 and the first Twenty (20) schools would be entertained on 'First Come First Serve' basis. Each student is entitled to submit only ONE entry and each school is entitled to submit a maximum of TEN entries.
- D. Competition guestions would be distributed commencing Mar 25, 2024.
- E. Student participants are expected to receive the competition questions by April 12, 2024. No compensation in marking would be offered for late access to competition questions.
- F. Competition submission dates are from Mar 25, 2024 to April 12, 2024.
- G. Closing date for the competition is April 12, 2024, at 11:59pm (GMT +8).
- H. Late entries WILL NOT BE accepted beyond this deadline.

Submission of Entries

- A. Students will submit a file in the .tns format and the submission of the file should be in the form of lastname_firstname_name_of_school.tns. Only solutions entered and worked through entirely via the .tns file will be considered as valid entries upon submission.
- B. Participants are required to complete **Nine** questions of varying length and difficulty in the .tns file.
- C. Submit the .tns file to an assigned submission folder (the link will be sent to the teacher-incharge) or to <u>ibmathtinspire@gmail.com</u>.
- D. Students will need to have access to their <u>TI-Nspire software</u> installed on their computers to be able to submit solutions by inserting the pages and writing their solutions entirely on their GDC.

- F. Participants are required to work on this competition independently and submit the solutions that reflect their own work.

- C. Place all the entries in a folder, giving it your school name/initials, for example "ihs" for International High School. Ensure that all the files are present.
- D. Submit the .tns file to an assigned submission folder (the link will be shared with the teacher-incharge) or to <u>ibmathtinspire@gmail.com</u>.
